## OVERVIEW

The Japan-U.S. Science Communication & Policy Fellowship Network Program (Program) will promote meaningful cooperation between the two countries on global challenges by bridging a critical gap between science and policy.

The Program brings together early-career scientists from Japan and the U.S. to engage in bilateral training and exchange for effective communication towards strategic collaboration with policymakers. Selected Fellows will participate in a year-long cohort experience and receive training to communicate science-informed policy to a wide audience.

# ELIBILITY

Please check the requirements below to see if you are eligible to apply for this program.

 You are an early-career scientist based in Japan or the U.S.

 You are within 10 years of having completed their PhD (advanced PhD students and postdocs may apply) .

 Your field of study or area of research is related to global issues of climate change, energy, health/biotech, transportation, artificial intelligence, engineering, and quantum computing.

 You demonstrate sufficient proficiency in English to actively participate in the program and complete the writing assignment.

 You are committed to the program's aims and desire to contribute as members of a long-term network.

Please note that the training sessions will be conducted in English without interpretation.
